

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

(Support of Indian Housing)

RES. NO. 172-86


1 WHEREAS, The Papago Council has learned of the proposed cuts or reductions in
2 funding for Indian housing in response to the mandate of the Balanced
3 Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 (P. L. 99-177); and
4
5 WHEREAS, The Papago Council does not support the budget deficit reduction
6 mandate, it does not support the termination of Indian housing funding
7 because of the extreme shortage and need for adequate housing within
8 the Papago Reservation and throughout Indian country; and
9
10 WHEREAS, The Papago Council supports and urges the Congress to authorize any
11 existing units now in the pipeline to be reassigned to another
12 housing authority to avoid total loss of existing projects; and
13
14 WHEREAS, There is a continuing severe and unmet need to provide adequate
15 housing for Indians which will not be satisfied and effectively frus-
16 trated by the President's latest proposal to reduce or terminate
17 public housing funds; and

19 WHEREAS, It would be in the interest of all Indian Tribes benefitting from
20 Indian housing programs to distinguish and separate from Public
21 Housing, all Indian housing projects, because it would recognize and
22 reaffirm the President's policy of working on a Government to
23 government relationship with Indian Tribes and differentiate the
24 differences between Indian Housing and Public Housing; and

26 WHEREAS, The Papago Council strongly supports continued funding for Indian
27 housing units for FY 1987 and thereafter until Indian housing needs
28 are satisfied;

30 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby
31 strongly oppose any reduction or termination of Indian Housing fund-
32 ing and urges Congress to review and scrutinize the merits of the
President's proposal taking into account the existing and continuing
severe shortage and need of adequate housing for Indians; and

1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby recommend and
2 urge Congress to consider and authorize any existing units now under
3 contract or assigned to be reassigned to another housing authority to
4 avoid a loss of such units, and, further, the Papago Council urges
5 Congress to separate Indian housing from Public Housing noting the
6 difference in need and shortage in Indian housing development, and,
7 further, to underscore the government to government policy reaffirmed
8 by the President; and

10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Papago Council strongly supports and urges the
11 continued funding of Indian housing development during FY 87 and
12 thereafter, and further opposes any action to zero out FY 86
13 projects.

14 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 28th
15 day of February, 1986, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote
16 of 1640.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and 01 absent, pursuant to the
17 authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (d), (f) and (h) of Article
18 V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended,
19 ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary
of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June
18 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the Secre-
19 tary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by the
Papago Council.
