

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

(Recommending G.A. to be included in Exempt Category)

RES. NO. 174-86

1 WHEREAS, The Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 (P. L.
2 77-199) was passed by Congress and mandates deficit reductions by
3 the fiscal year 1991; and
4

5 WHEREAS, Congress recognized the serve impact of this mandate on certain pro-
6 grams and provided for special treatment of certain programs including
7 foster care, adoption assistance unemployment compensation, child
8 support enforcement, etc., and Congress further exempted from seques-
9 tration eight low income programs; Medicaid, AFDC, WIC, SSI, FOOD
10 STAMPS, CHILD NUTRITION, VETERANS COMPENSATION AND VETERANS PENSIONS:

13 WHEREAS, The Papago Council urges and recommends to Congress to include in the
14 exempt category General Assistance payments to indigent families
15 because of the basis for this program, i.e. poverty, and because any
16 reductions will severely impact eligible recipients; and


17 WHEREAS, The Papago Tribal Social Service program provides General Assistance
18 payments using AFDC criteria for eligibility and would not be availa-
19 ble from any other source if reduced or terminated.

20 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby
21 strongly support and urges Congress to consider and include the
22 General Assistance payments in the exempt category protecting it from
23 sequestration under the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control
24 Act of 1985.

26 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 28th
27 day of February, 1986, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote
28 of 1225.0 for; 293.5 against; 121.5 not voting; and 01 absent, pursuant to the
29 authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (d), (f) and (h) of Article
30 V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended,
31 ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secre-
32 tary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of
June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the
Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by
the Papago Council.
