

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

(Recommending Food Distribution to be included in exempt category)

RES. NO. 175-86

1 WHEREAS, The Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 (P. L.
2 99-177) was enacted into law and mandates deficit reduction during
3 the next five fiscal years; and
4

5 WHEREAS, Congress provided special rules for the treatment of certain programs
6 including exemption from sequestration eight low-income programs in-
7 cluding FOOD STAMPS; and


8 WHEREAS, The Papago Council has learned that the Food Distribution program, a
9 vital part of the overall tribal effort to supplement low, fixed
10 income of tribal members is not exempt or protected from the mandate
11 of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act; and

13 WHEREAS, The Food Distribution program is a necessary and viable alternative
14 to the Food Stamp program on the Papago Reservation;

15 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby
16 strongly support and urges Congress to include the Food Distribution
17 program (Commodity foods) in the exempt category protecting it from
18 sequestration in the same manner as the Food Stamp program.

20 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 28th
21 day of February, 1986, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote
22 of 1460.5 for; -0- against; 179.5 not voting; and 01 absent, pursuant to the
23 authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (d), (f) and (h) of Article
24 V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended,
25 ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secre-
26 tary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of
27 June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the
28 Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by
29 the Papago Council.
