

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

(LAW ENFORCEMENT EMERGENCY NEED)

RES. NO. 177-86

1 WHEREAS, The Papago Council has prioritized programs and services in light of
2 certain budget reductions mandated by the Balanced Budget and
3 Emergency Control Act of 1985; and
4

5 WHEREAS, The Papago Council has determined that certain programs and services
6 will be adversely affected by proposed reductions and impact basic
7 human services; and

8 WHEREAS, The Papago Council has learned that law enforcement services is
9 critically deficient in certain remote areas of the Papago Reser-
10 vation because of manpower and vehicle shortages resulting in limited
11 and minimal coverage; and

12 WHEREAS, The Papago Council has further learned of special and particularly
13 dangerous law enforcement situations presented by the International
14 Boundary and the problems presented by illegal smuggling of drugs
15 and illegal enteries of Mexican and South American nationals onto
16 the Papago Reservation; and

18 WHEREAS, The Papago Police Department has not taken the primary lead in
19 patrolling the International Boundary but assists and cooperate with
20 the U.S. Border Patrol and the U.S. Customs when necessary; and


22 WHEREAS, The Papago Police department can not, because of manpower shortages
23 and vehicle limitations, provide adequate and responsive services to
24 the Baboquivari, Chukut-Kuk, Gu Vo and Pisinemo Districts when prob-
25 lems such as rustling, smuggling and other boundary-related incidents
26 occur; and

27 WHEREAS, The Papago Council has determined that in light of recent incidents
28 which have endanger law enforcement personnel and presented a clear
29 danger to residents to those Districts bordering the International
30 boundary, law enforcement must be prioritize at the highest level
31 to adequately call attention to this critical need;


1 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby
2 designates Law Enforcement Services as an emergency need requiring
3 immediate attention and, hereby requests Congress to authorize
4 additional funds to bring the Papago Law Enforcement program to
5 the exemplary level of funding to enable it to hire needed personnel
6 and purchase vehicles to begin to provide responsive and adequate
7 law enforcement services to critical areas of the Papago reservation.

9 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 28th
10 day of February, 1986, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote
11 of 1384.0 for; -0- against; 256.0 not voting; and 01 absent, pursuant to the
12 authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (d), (f) and (h) of Article
13 V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended,
14 ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary
of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of
June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the
Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by
the Papago Council.
