

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

(San Xavier Co-op loan)

RES. NO. 17-86

1 WHEREAS, On the 2nd day of June, 1981, the Tribal Council enacted Ordinance  
2 No. 02-81 wherein it approved the Restated Charter of the San Xavier  
3 Cooperative Association, Inc., a nonprofit cooperative Tribal associ-  
4 ation whose membership consists of allottees; and

5  
6 WHEREAS, The cooperative association has been farming the allottee memberships  
7 land in an effort to improve the social conditions and economic  
8 welfare of its members and to create employment for the Papago people;  
9 and

10 WHEREAS, Under the terms of the Southern Arizona Water Project Settlement Act  
11 of 1982, P.L. 97-293, the Secretary of the Interior, acting through  
12 the Bureau of Reclamation, is in the process of improving and ex-  
13 tending the Cooperative Association irrigation system, including the  
14 replacement or relocation of existing wells and the drilling of new  
15 wells; and

16  
17 WHEREAS, The Cooperative Association farming activities have been curtailed  
18 due to the lack of ground water and in 1985 the Cooperative Associ-  
19 ation planted cotton using funds acquired from a Producers Cotton Oil  
20 Company crop loan, and expecting to receive additional water from a  
21 new well that was in the process of being drilled with funds author-  
22 ized and appropriated under the Settlement Act; and

23  
24 WHEREAS, The new well did not produce the anticipated quantity of water neces-  
25 sary to irrigate this cotton crop, and subsequently a good portion of  
26 cotton was lost; and

27 WHEREAS, It is necessary under the law to plow under all cotton stocks and  
28 maintain weed and insect control, and the Association is without funds  
29 to comply with this law; and

30  
31 WHEREAS, The Cooperative Association owes Producers Cotton Oil Company the sum  
32 of approximately \$100,000.00 for its 1985 crop loan which the Coopera-  
tive Association was unable to repay; and

2 WHEREAS, The Cooperative Association will need the sum of \$80,100.00 to  
3 continue its farming operation for the 1986 crop year; a budget is  
4 attached hereto and made a part thereof; and


5 WHEREAS, The Cooperative Association is prepared to repay the \$80,100.00 from  
6 its 1986 crop production sale income and the \$100,000.00 used to repay  
7 Producers Cotton in five equal installments comencing January 1, 1990;  
8 and

9  
10 WHEREAS, The San Xavier Cooperative Association is prepared to execute the  
11 necessary documents that would obligate the Association to repay this  
12 loan from future profits of this farming entity.

13 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOVLED that the Treasurer make a loan to the San Xavier  
14 Cooperative Association in the amount of \$180,100,00 provided that the  
15 Association execute the proper documents that would obligate the  
16 Association to repay to the Tribe \$80,100.00 from its 1986 crop  
17 production sale income and \$100,000.00 in five equal installments  
18 commencing January 1, 1990.

20 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 10th  
21 day of January, 1986, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote  
22 of 1581.5 for; 58.5 against; -0- not voting; and 01 absent, pursuant to the  
23 authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2(h) and 3(a) of Article V  
24 of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended,  
25 ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secre-  
tary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of  
June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of  
its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to  
review by the Secretary of the Interior.
