

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

(In Support of Community Health Representative Program)

RES. NO. 178-86

1 WHEREAS, The Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 (P.L.
2 99-177) mandates that budget deficits be reduced within the next five
3 (5) fiscal years beginning with FY 1986; and

4
5 WHEREAS, The President has proposed the FY 87 Federal budget keeping budget
6 requests in line with the mandate of the Balanced budget and Emergency
7 Deficit Control Act; and

8 WHEREAS, The Papago Council has learned that the President's budget proposes to
9 terminate certain federal programs including Community Health
10 Representatives (CHR) program under the Indian Health Service budget;
11 and

13 WHEREAS, The Papago Council has consistently urged Congress to fund the CHR
14 program because of its invaluable benefit in providing services in
15 areas of mental health, elderly care, nutrition, alcoholism,
16 environmental health delivery by CHR workers in remote areas of the
17 Papago Reservation; and WHEREAS, The termination of the CHR program
18 will not only severely impact the delivery of health care to remote
19 areas of the Papago Reservation, it will impact on the employment of
20 52 persons; and

22 WHEREAS, No valid or compelling reason has been presented by the President for
23 proposing to eliminate the CHR program.


24 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby
25 strongly oppose the proposed termination of the CHR program and
26 respectfully urges Congress to continue budget and program authority
27 for the CHR program at least at the FY 85 levels, but preferably at
28 the more realistic level often justified by Indian Tribes.

30 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 28th
31 day of February, 1986, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote
32 of 1511.5 for; -0- against; 128.5 not voting; and 02 absent, pursuant to the
authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (d), (f) and (h) of Article
V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended,
ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secre-
