

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
(In Support of Direct Appropriation to Tribes
For Health Related Activities)

RES. NO. 181-86

1 WHEREAS, The Papago Tribe supports and encourages sound fiscal management of
2 limited health care resources; and

3 WHEREAS, The impact of Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985
4 (P.L. 99-177) will significantly affect many tribal health programs and
5 services; and

7 WHEREAS, The President's Budget for FY 87' clearly reflects the Administrations
8 intent to further reduced funding for Indian Care; and

9 WHEREAS, The Papago Tribe is interested in actively participating in the
10 decision-making process to determine the most appropriate and efficient
11 use of its limited health resources; and

12 WHEREAS, A policy to compliment the intent of the Self-Determination law,
13 whereby a Tribe, rather than IHS, would be accountable for health
14 delivery, is recommended by the Papago Council; and

16 WHEREAS, The Papago Tribe further recommends that Congress consider direct
17 appropriations to Tribes to encourage sophistication in tribal fiscal
18 management based on a commitment to consumer satisfaction.


19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby support
20 and urge the continued policy of self-determination and recommends to
21 Congress to consider direct appropriations to Tribes to encourage
22 accountability for delivery of health care services and sound fiscal
23 management.

26 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 28th day
27 of February, 1986, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
28 1456.0 for; 63.0 against; 120.5 not voting; and -01 absent, pursuant to the
29 authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (d), (f) and (h) of Article V of the
30 Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe as amended, ratified by the Papago
31 Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on
32 January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat.
984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the Secretary of Interior and
is effective as of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
