

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
(Administration, Children, Youth and Families)

RES. NO. 196-86

1 WHEREAS, The Tohono O'odham Human Services Department has the primary responsi-
2 bility to provide for the care, treatment and welfare of children
3 found to be in need of such care; and

4 WHEREAS, The Arizona Department of Economic Security provides funds for de-
5 velopment of child abuse and neglect prevention programs under
6 specified terms and conditions; and

7 WHEREAS, The incidence of teenage parents of the Tohono O'odham Reservation is
8 high and school based parent effectiveness and child development
9 program is not available to this group; and

10 WHEREAS, The Tohono O'odham Human Service Department is capable of developing
11 and administering a program that will focus on keeping teenage parents
12 in school and provide educational component to increase parent skills;
13 and

14 WHEREAS, The need for such a program is well documented and Tohono O'odham
15 Human Services is capable of implementing the program.

16 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Council that it does here-
17 by approve the application of the Tohono O'odham Human Services for a
18 grant to develop and implement a Teen Parent Program which will de-
19 crease the incidents of child abuse and neglect and decrease school
20 drop-outs of teen parents through a school based program with educa-
21 tional and social service component.


22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Josiah Moore, Chairman; Francisco Jose, Jr., Vice-
23 Chairman; or Rosita Ruiz, Treasurer; of the Tohono O'odham Council is
24 hereby authorized to negotiate and execute this Grant and any amend-
25 ments thereto for the duration of the Grant.

26 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 13th
27 day of March, 1986 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
28 1581.5 for; -0- against; 58.5 not voting; and -0- absent, pursuant to the
29 authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) and (h) of Article V
30 of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended,
31 ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the
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Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
