

RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM COUNCIL
(Papago Farming Authority - Loan Guaranty)

RES. NO. 218-86

1 WHEREAS, on the 10th day of January, 1986, the Tohono O'odham Council passed
2 Resolution No. 16-86 wherein it authorized the Treasurer and the
3 Chairman to issue a new Continuing Guaranty wherein the Tribe would
4 collateralize up to \$100,000.00 of any 1986 crop loan from Producers
5 Cotton Oil Company to the Papago Farming Authority with the condition
6 that this Continuing Guaranty would be cancelled when the 1986 crop
7 loan is paid in full; and

9 WHEREAS, as a condition to paying \$100,000.00 to Producers Cotton Oil Company
10 in satisfaction of a Continuing Guaranty executed by the Tribe on May
11 8, 1985, and executing the new Continuing Guaranty, the Farming
12 Authority was required to execute the necessary documents obligating
13 the Authority to repay the \$100,000.00 from future profits and/or from
14 the \$750,000.00 the Farming Authority will receive if the proposed Tat
15 Momolik Dam settlement legislation is successfully enacted into law;

18 WHEREAS, it was the intention of the Papago Farming Authority to use a Pro-
19 ducers Cotton Oil Company crop loan to farm the Viava Vo farms and
20 leave fallow this year the Papago Farms area, but the people re-
21 siding in the Chukut Kuk District have expressed a strong desire to
22 the authority to continue the farming operations at Papago Farms and
23 to do so would require an increase in the amount of crop financing
24 that would have to be acquired from Producers Cotton Oil Company; and

26 WHEREAS, Producers Cotton Oil Company has financed the Farming Authority for
27 one-half to three quarters of a million dollars in crop loans for each
28 crop from 1980 through 1984 using the existing farm equipment, crops
29 and for the 1985 \$100,000.00 Continuing Guaranty as collateral but due
30 to depreciation of the farm equipment and financial conditions of the
31 farming industry, Producers Cotton Oil Company has decided that it
32 will require an increase in the Continuing Guaranty from \$100,000.00

1 to \$400,000.00 before it can make the necessary crop loan to farm both
2 Viava Vo farms and the Papago farms; and

3 WHEREAS, it is the intention of the Farming Authority to acquire Federal Crop
4 insurance on all crops grown so as to insure the Tribe against crop
5 failure due to freezes, hail, floods, insects and other causes beyond
6 the control of the Farming Authority; and

7 WHEREAS, the Papago Farming Authority is prepared to execute all necessary doc-
8 uments which will obligate the Farming Authority to repay the Tribe
9 any sums that might become the obligation of the Tribe due to the
10 issuance of its \$400,000.00 Continuing Guaranty from future profits
11 and/or from the \$750,000.00 the Farming Authority will receive if the
12 proposed Tat Momolik Dam settlement legislation is successfully en-
13 acted into law.

15 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Treasurer and the Chairman issue a new
16 Continuing Guaranty wherein the Tribe would collateralize up to
17 \$400,000.00, a 1986 crop loan from Producers Cotton Oil Company to the
18 Papago Farming Authority, with the condition that this Continuing Gua-
19 ranty would be cancelled when the 1986 crop loan is paid in full.

21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that as a condition to the issuance of the new Con-
22 tinuing Guaranty for \$400,000.00, the existing \$100,000.00 Continuing
23 Guaranty will be voided and returned to the Tribe.

24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that as a future condition to the issuance of the new
25 Continuing guaranty for \$400,000.00, the Papago Farming Authority
26 shall execute the necessary documents obligating the Farming Authority
27 to repay the Tribe any sums that might become the obligation of the
28 Tribe due to the issuance of its \$400,000.00 Continuing Guaranty from
29 future profits and/or from the \$750,000.00 the Farming Authority will
30 receive if the proposed Tat Momolik Dam settlement legislation is
31 successfully enacted into law.

1 The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council on the 24th
2 day of March, 1986, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
3 1502.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and 138.0 absent, pursuant to the
4 powers vested in the Council by Section 1 (d) of Article VI of the Consti-
5 tution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on
6 January 18, 1986, and approved by Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs
7 (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18,
8 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution was presented for approval to the
9 Chairman of the Tohono O'odham Nation on the 31st day of March, 1986 at
10 9:23 o'clock, A.M., pursuant to the provisions of Section 5 of Article VII
11 of the Constitution and will become effective upon his approval; provided, how-
12 ever, that if it was passed by the Council pursuant to the powers vested in the
13 Council by Section 2 of Article VI of the Constitution it shall become ef-
14 fective only upon the further approval of the Secretary of the Interior.
