

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
(Priorities for Federal FY 87 Appropriations)

RES. NO. 34-86

1 WHEREAS, The Papago Council has been advised that the sequestrations mandated
2 by Gramm-Rudman (the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act
3 of 1985, P.L. 99-177) will have a very serious impact on FY86 funded
4 Indian programs, and that they may have a devastating impact on future
5 programs unless Congress substantailly increases FY87 funding levels
6 therefor; and
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8 WHEREAS, The Papago Council has appointed a special delegation of its members
9 to travel to Washington, D.C. and testify before the appropriate
10 committees of Congress concerning Federal FY87 Appropriations for
11 Indian programs; and
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13 WHEREAS, In an attempt to inform Congress, the Papago Council has attempted to
14 prioritize and list those tribal programs which, if the funding levels
15 therefor are reduced below present appropriations, would be most
16 seriously affected and thus critically impact the health, education
17 and welfare of the Papago Tribe and its members.

18 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it respectfully
19 urges Congress to assure that FY87 appropriations to cover the
20 following programs administered under the provisions of the Snyder
21 Act, 25 U.S.C. 13, be set at such levels that they will not be
22 affected either by sequestrations or executive rescissions, namely:
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- 24 1. Education
- 25 2. Health
- 26 3. Roads
- 27 4. Housing
- 28 5. Human Services

29 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 6th day
30 of February, 1986, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
31 1640.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and 01 absent, pursuant to the au-
32 thority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (d) of Article V of the
Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended, ratified
by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the


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1 Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934
2 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the Secretary of
3 the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by the Papago
4 Council.
