

RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

(Tohono O'Odham Youth Crime Prevention Program)

RES. NO. 365-86

1 WHEREAS, The Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act of 1974 mandates
2 to States the development of a rlexible network of service and
3 placement options for alleged Juvenile offenders, and (2) maintenance
4 of a Juvenile's family and Community ties; and
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6 WHEREAS, The Act mandates to States planning and implementation process for-
7 which; (1) is based upon a recognition of youth rights and due process
8 and which promotes the advocacy of such, and (2) uses active citizen
9 participation and youth involvement; and

10 WHEREAS, The Act mandates to states enhanced capacity for parents, schools and
11 police to resolve problems of youth in a non-judicial manner and thus
12 alleviate the use of jails and lock-ups. This includes, where ap-
13 propriate, the coordination and integration of public and private
14 child welfare services; and
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16 WHEREAS, The Act mandates to States identification and description of viable
17 alternatives to the use of jails and lock-ups; and

18 WHEREAS, The Tohono O'odham Nation of Arizona has expressed a willingness to
19 participate in the provisions of the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency
20 Prevention Act of 1974 where applicable as stated in Resolution Number
21 24-81; and

23 WHEREAS, The Tohono O'odham Children's Court has submitted a proposal for 1986
24 Juvenile Justice and Delinquene Preventions Subgrant funds entitled
25 The Tohono O'odham Youth Crime Prevention Program which addresses
26 systems improvements, prevention and intervention.

27 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Council continues to
28 support the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act of 1974
29 provisions where applicable, and supports the implementing of the
30 Tohono O'odham Youth Crime Prevention Program by the Tohono O'odham
31 Children's Court.

1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Nation that, without in any way
2 intending to derogate on or affect the independent status and sover-
3 eign powers of the Tohono O'odham Nation, the Tohono O'odham Nation
4 agrees to cooperate with Arizona Office of Economic and Planning and
5 Tohono O'odham Children's Court in all aspects of implementation of
6 the initiatives of the Tohono O'odham Youth Crime Prevention Program.

7 The foregoing resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council on the 10th
8 day of July, 1986, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
9 1640.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and -0- absent, pursuant to the powers
10 vested in the Council by Section 1 (f) of Article VI of the Constitution of the
11 Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18,
12 1986, and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs
13 (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18,
14 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
