

RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Modification of Gila Bend Reservation Settlement Bill)

RES. NO. 385-86

1 WHEREAS, On the 21st day of August, 1985, the San Lucy District Council duly
2 enacted Resolution No. 36-85 wherein it approved a Legislative Bill
3 regarding the Gila Bend Reservation substantially in conformity with
4 the terms and conditions of the proposed Congressional Bill attached
5 hereto and made a part hereof; and

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7 WHEREAS, On the 4th day of April, 1985, the Tohono O'odham Council duly enacted
8 Resolution No. 43-84 wherein it approved the terms and conditions of
9 the proposed Legislation attached hereto, with the condition that any
10 material modifications, alterations, changes or additions to the Legis-
11 lation that would affect the benefits to be received by the District
12 and the Nation must first be subject to approval of the District and
13 the Nation; and

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15 WHEREAS, It has been proposed by Congressional staff that in order to meet some
16 of the objections of the Administration and improve the prospects for
17 the enactment of beneficial Legislation, Section 4(a) should be modi-
18 fied substantially as follows:

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20 1. The \$30,000,000 to be paid to the Nation for the assignment of
21 9,880 acres of land within the Gila Bend Reservation would be
22 modified so that the Nation would receive \$15,000,000 in cash
23 with interest from the date of enactment and the right to acquire
24 available BLM land in the State of Arizona under the control of
25 the Secretary of the Interior having a value of \$15,000,000 at
26 date of the enactment.
- 27 2. The Nation would have the right to sell or exchange this BLM land
28 for the State or private lands within the State of Arizona.
- 29 3. Proceeds of any sale of BLM lands and the \$15,000,000 received by
30 the Nation for assigning 9,880 acres of land within the Gila Bend
31 Reservation shall be held and used in accordance with the pro-
32 visions of Section 5(a) of the Congressional Bill attached hereto;
and

WHEREAS, The other provisions of the proposed Legislation shall remain basically
intact; and

WHEREAS, The San Lucy District Council has enacted a resolution approving the
above modification to the proposed Legislation if the Congressional

1 Delegation decides that it will be beneficial for the enactment of
2 this Legislation into law and has requested that the Tohono O'odham
3 Council enact a similar resolution, a copy of said resolution is
4 attached hereto and made a part hereof.

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6 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Council does hereby
7 approve the above modifications to the Gila Bend proposed Legislation
8 if the Congressional Delegation decides that it will be beneficial for
9 the enactment of this Legislation into law.

10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any other material, modification, alteration,
11 changes, additions to the Legislation that would affect the benefits
12 to be received by the District and the Nation must first be subject to
13 the approval of the District and the Nation.

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15 The foregoing resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council on the 8th
16 day of August, 1986, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
17 1397.0 for; 126.0 against; 117.0 not voting; and 02 absent, pursuant to the
18 powers vested in the Council by Section 1(j) of Article VI of the Constitution
19 of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January
20 18, 1986, and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian
21 Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of
22 June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
