RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

(Pisinemo Agriculture Economic Development Project)

RES. NO. 45-86

1 WHEREAS, Pisinemo District initiated the Santa Cruz Demonstration Farm to
2 revitalize the agricultural economy of the Reservation and to provide
3 fresh local food; and

4
5 WHEREAS, Pisinemo District has organized a public body known as the Pisinemo
6 Development Authority to own and manage new District business enter-
7 prises to the District and to the Papago Tribe; and


8 WHEREAS, The Administration for Native American (ANA), has announced the
9 availability of financial assistance to promote self sufficiency
10 through support of local, social and economic development projects.

11 WHEREAS, The Pisinemo Development Authority has developed an Agriculture Eco-
12 nomic Development proposal to promote self sufficiency.

14 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Council supports the establish-
15 ment by the Pisinemo Development Authority of the proposed Agricultur-
16 al Services and also supports the Pisinemo Development Authority in
17 identifying funds as are available from Federal agencies for agri-
18 cultural development, on the condition that such funds are not funds
19 from which Papago or Vaiva Vo Farms or other Tribal agricultural
20 programs are normally funded, and that the Pisinemo Agriculture Eco-
21 nomic Development Project proposal will not compete for funding with
22 any current Tribal programs.

24 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 12th
25 day of February, 1986, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote
26 of 1640.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and 04 absent, pursuant to the
27 authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) and (f) of Article V
28 of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended,
29 ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secre-
30 tary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of
31 June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the
32 Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by
the Papago Council.
