

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

(Holding Constitutional Caucus, March 10-11, 1986)
(Reschedule of March regular sessions of Papago Council
to March 12-13, 1986)

1 WHEREAS, The Council Policy & Procedure Committee has developed a legislative
2 agenda identifying tasks to be addressed by the Council in order to
3 comply with provisions of the new Constitution; and


5 WHEREAS, one of the identified tasks on the agenda calls for the Council to
6 hold a constitutional caucus to adopt the necessary guidelines,
7 policy & procedures, and/or regulations that may be required to
8 comply with the new Constitution, and to provide direction for
9 Council Standing Committees and other entities in regards to official
10 status during the interim constitutional transition period.

12 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it shall hold a
13 Constitutional caucus on March 10-11, 1986 and adopt necessary
14 guidelines, policy & procedures, and/or regulations that may be
15 required to comply with the new Constitution and to provide direction
16 for Council Standing Committees and other entities in regards to
17 official status during the interim transitional period.

19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the regular sessions of the Papago Council
20 scheduled for March 5 & 6, 1986 are hereby rescheduled to be held on
21 March 12 & 13, 1986.

22 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 13th
23 day of February, 1986, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote
24 of 1095.5 for; 544.5 against; -0- not voting; and 01 absent, pursuant to the
25 authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (e) and (f) of Article V
26 of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended,
27 ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary
of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of
June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the
Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by
the Papago Council
