

RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Approving Application for Indian Low-Income
Housing Program)

RES. NO. 179-88

1 WHEREAS, it is the policy of this locality to eliminate
2 substandard and other inadequate housing, to prevent the
3 spread of slums and blight, and to realize as soon as
4 feasible the goal of a decent home in a suitable living
5 environment for all of its citizens; and

6 WHEREAS, under the provisions of the United States Housing Act of
7 1937, as amended, the United States of America, acting
8 through the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development
9 (herein called the "Government"), is authorized to
10 provide financial assistance to local public housing
11 agencies for undertaking and carrying out preliminary
12 planning of low-income housing projects that will
13 assist in meeting this goal; and

14 WHEREAS, Section 213 of the Housing and Community Development Act
15 of 1974 provides that the local unit of government be
16 given the opportunity to comment on and/or object to the
17 approval of an application on grounds of inconsistency
18 with local housing assistance planning; and

19 WHEREAS, the ultimate responsibility for the administration and
20 maintenance of reservation roads rests with the local
21 tribal government; and

22 WHEREAS, the local housing authority is a public body and the
23 property of the local housing authority is declared to
24 be public property used for essential public and
25 governmental purposes; and

26 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'Odham Indian Housing Authority (herein
27 called "Local Authority") is a public housing agency and
28 is applying to the government for a grant to cover the
29 costs of surveys and planning in connection with the
30 development of low-income housing.

31 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Governing Council of the
32 Tohono O'Odham Nation as follows:

- 1 1. That there exists within the jurisdiction of this
2 Governing Council a need for such low-income housing
3 which is not being met by private enterprise.
- 4 2. That the application of the Local Authority to the
5 Government for a grant in an amount not to exceed 3
6 percent of the Total Development Cost which can be
7 supported by the amount of the ACC for surveys and
8 planning in connection with low-income housing
9 projects of not to exceed approximately 10 dwelling
10 units is hereby approved.
- 11 3. That there is no objection to the Local Authority's
12 application to HUD for additional housing, (a) due to
13 any inconsistency with a HUD-approved Housing
14 Assistance Plan for the locality or localities under
15 consideration; or (b) since a definite need for the
16 housing exists even though a Housing Assistance Plan
17 may not be in effect; and (c) since public
18 facilities and services are or will be available and
19 adequate to serve the proposed housing in the areas
20 mentioned.
- 21 4. The Indian Housing Authority will proceed with the
22 project as acquisition of existing housing or
23 rehabilitation as required by paragraph 6(H) of the
24 Act, if the Field Office determines as a result of
25 HUD review of the submitted cost comparison (or
26 insufficient existing housing) documentation that
27 rehabilitation or acquisition of existing housing
28 would cost less than new construction (or that
29 sufficient existing housing is available).
- 30 5. Upon dedication by the local housing authority of
31 roads contained within completed housing projects
32 funded under the United States Housing Act of 1937,
as amended, the Tohono O'Odham Nation shall accept
the said project streets into the local street and
highway system.
6. By this resolution the Tohono O'Odham Nation hereby
requests that the Bureau of Indian Affairs add the
streets and roads to the Federal Aid Indian Road
System for maintenance pursuant to 25 CFR paragraph
170.6

The foregoing resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council on the 7th day of July, 1988 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1,508.5 for; -0- against; 131.5 not voting; and 02 absent, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section 1 of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986, and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
