

RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Funding for Tohono O'odham High School)

RES. NO. 39-88

1 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation continues to support full
2 funding of the Tohono O'odham High School; and

3 WHEREAS, there exist needs to have additional funding to complete
4 construction and start-up cost; and

5 WHEREAS, a feasibility study was conducted before the school was
6 constructed showing a need to have cottages constructed
7 for students who reside more than an hour bus ride from
8 the school; and

9 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legisla-
10 tive Council respectfully request Congress to
11 appropriate funding for the Tohono O'odham High School
12 for student cottages, which was justified based on a
13 feasibility study which indicated a need to have a
14 residential program in place. The Tohono O'odham
15 Legislative Council does consider the student cottages
16 and start up cost as priorities and request continuous
17 funding until they are completed.


18 The foregoing resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council
19 on the 19th day of February, 1988, at a meeting at which a quorum
20 was present with a vote of 1,640.0 for; -0- against; -0- not
21 voting; and 01 absent, pursuant to the powers vested in the
22 Council by Section 1(c)(2) & (f) of Article IV of the Consti-
23 tution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono
24 O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986, and approved by the Acting
25 Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March
26 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48
27 Stat. 984).



submittal.


