

LEGISLATIVE ORDER OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM COUNCIL
(Referring draft resolution regarding Tyrone Childs
to the Domestic Affairs Committee)

LEGISLATIVE ORDER NO. 122-90

1 WHEREAS, on April 24, 1990, the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council
2 conducted an emergency meeting to review a proposed
3 resolution requesting for assistance and support for the
4 family of Tyrone Childs who was shot and killed by a Pima
5 County Deputy Sheriff on April 1, 1990; and

6 WHEREAS, the proposed resolution requests Congressional support
7 for an independent and thorough investigation on the
8 shooting death of Tyrone Childs; and

9 WHEREAS, counselling support services for the family, legal support
10 and assistance, and the establishment of a police
11 monitoring agency to be created in Ajo to alleviate
12 community tensions were also requested; and

13 WHEREAS, a recommendation was made to have the appropriate Legis-
14 lative Committee review the draft resolution before the
15 Legislature takes formal action on the matter.

16 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative
17 Council that it hereby refers the draft resolution titled,
18 "Requesting the Investigation of the Shooting Death of
19 Tyrone Childs" to the Domestic Affairs Committee for
20 review and recommendation, in particular the assistance
21 request clause.

22 BE IT FURTHER ORDERED that the Domestic Affairs Committee is
23 authorized to meet and consult with the Executive
24 Committee on this matter.

25 BE IT FURTHER ORDERED that this issue be returned to the next
26 Tohono O'odham Legislative Council special meeting to be
27 conducted in April.


28 The foregoing Order was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council on

16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
