

LEGISLATIVE ORDER OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL  
(Establishment of a Standing Appropriations Committee)

LEGISLATIVE ORDER NO. 136-90

1 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council, by Resolution No.  
2 370-89 appointed five (5) Legislative Council members to  
3 testify and lobby in behalf of the Tohono O'odham Nation's  
4 priorities and funding requests before the Congressional  
5 Appropriations Committee, Congressional Representative(s)  
6 and Federal Agencies; and

7 WHEREAS, the Nation's Delegation did submit the Tohono O'odham  
8 Nation's priority list and proposed funding requests to  
9 the appropriate Congressional Committee, Representatives  
10 and Federal Agencies; and

11 WHEREAS, the delegation did receive additional information  
12 pertaining to various proposed funding and requests; and

13 WHEREAS, contact with various other Federal Agencies still needs  
14 to be followed up to identify available resources; and

15 WHEREAS, the delegation members recommended that a Standing  
16 Appropriations Committee be created to meet, as needed,  
17 to follow-up on the Federal Congressional Appropriations  
18 process.

19 NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Tohono O'odham Legislative  
20 Council supports the creation of a Standing Appropriations  
21 Committee to follow-up on Congressional Appropriations and  
22 to assess the Tohono O'odham priorities.


23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the terms of the Standing  
24 Appropriations Committee coincide with the Legislative  
25 Committee terms of office effectuating with the existing  
26 Appropriations Committee.

27 The foregoing Order was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council on the  
28 7th. day of May, 1990 at a meeting at which a quorum was present  
29 with a vote of 1,491.0 for; 127.0 against; 106.0 not voting; 03  
30 absent, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section  
31 1 (b) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham  
32 Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986,  
and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian  
Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of  
the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
