

RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL  
(Approving the Application of the Tohono O'odham  
Judiciary Crime Reduction Funds)

RES. NO. 364-90

1 WHEREAS, the State of Arizona established a Criminal Justice  
2 Enhancement Fund consisting of funds collected as penalty  
3 assessments on every fine, penalty and forfeiture paid to  
4 the Courts; and

5 WHEREAS, twelve percent of the funds are appropriated to the  
6 Supreme Court of Arizona for the purpose of reducing  
7 juvenile crime; and

8 WHEREAS, these juvenile crime reduction funds have not been  
9 available to Tribal Courts providing services to juveniles  
10 until 1989 when the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court  
11 amended the requirements making Tribal Courts eligible for  
12 the funds; and

13 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Judiciary did submit an application for  
14 Juvenile Crime Reduction funds and was notified that such  
15 funds were awarded; and

16 WHEREAS, the project proposed by the Tohono O'odham Judiciary will  
17 seek to establish an Intervention/Prevention Program  
18 within designated schools and provide referral and intake  
19 services for referred youth; and

20 WHEREAS, the objectives of the Project will be carried out by the  
21 Intervention Resource Officers assigned to work with  
22 designated schools; and

23 WHEREAS, the funds awarded by the Supreme Court will enable the  
24 hiring of the Intervention Resource Officers.

25 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative  
26 Council that it does hereby approve the application  
27 submitted by the Tohono O'odham Judiciary to receive  
28 Juvenile Crime Reduction Funds for the Intervention/  
29 Prevention Project and authorizes the receipt of such  
30 funds;

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1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman, Vice Chairman, or other  
 2 legally designated official are hereby authorized to  
 3 negotiate any and all documents necessary to execute the  
 4 grant including any amendments thereto, provided however,  
 5 that any amendments affecting the funding or funding  
 6 levels of the grant shall be submitted for further prior  
 7 approval by the Council.

8 The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council  
 9 on the 27th day of September, 1990 at a meeting at which a quorum  
 10 was present with a vote of 1,370.0 for; 176.5 against; 177.5 not  
 11 voting; 04 absent, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by  
 12 Section 1 (f) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono  
 O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18,  
 1986, and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary -  
 Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section  
 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
