

RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Approving Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention
Subgrant 1990)

RES. NO. 365-90

1 WHEREAS, The Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act of
2 1974, as amended by the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency
3 Prevention Amendment of 1988 (subtitle F of title VII of
4 the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988, P.L. 100-690) has been
5 reauthorized and modified to include a funding pass-
6 through requirement for Indian tribes;

7 WHEREAS, The Indian pass-through funds are determined by the
8 proportion of reservation youth to total Arizona youth,
9 and for 1990 the State of Arizona estimated this
10 allocation at \$50,531.00;

11 WHEREAS, The Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act was
12 enacted to authorize funding to states which targeted
13 juvenile delinquency activities toward jail and lockup
14 removal; and

15 WHEREAS, The Tohono O'odham Judiciary has been actively diverting
16 O'odham youth from lockup by carrying out a Diversion
17 Program for eligible youth; and

18 WHEREAS, The availability of Juvenile Justice funds provided an
19 opportunity for the Tohono O'odham Judiciary to expend the
20 Diversion Program with more alternative activities; and

21 WHEREAS, The Tohono O'odham Judiciary did submit an application for
22 a grant under the Indian pass-through allocation and was
23 successful resulting in a subgrant award of \$15,258.00 for
24 1990-91; and

25 WHEREAS, The subgrant award will supplement Diversion activities
26 and establish a law related education program for first
27 offenders as an alternative to formal prosecution and
28 disposition; and


29 WHEREAS, A resolution approving the initial application and
30 accepting the award are requirements before the subgrant
31 award becomes official;

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2 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative
3 Council that it does hereby approve the application
4 submitted by the Tohono O'odham Nation to receive Juvenile
5 Justice and Delinquency Prevention funds for the purpose
6 of expending existing diversions activities;

7 BE, IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman, Vice Chairman, or other
8 legally designated official are hereby authorized and
9 directed to negotiate and execute the subgrant documents
10 and any amendments thereto for the duration of the
11 subgrant, provided however, that any amendments affecting
12 the funding or funding levels of the subgrant shall be
13 submitted for further prior approval by the Council.


14 The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council
15 on the 26th. day of September, 1990 at a meeting at which a quorum
16 was present with a vote of 1,433.5 for; 113.0 against; 177.5 not
17 voting; 04 absent, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council
18 by Section 1 (f) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono
19 O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18,
1986, and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary -
Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section
16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).



submittal.

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
