The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council on the 26th. day of September, 1990 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1,433.5 for; 113.0 against; 177.5 not voting; 04 absent, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section 1 (f) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986, and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary -Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
