

LEGISLATIVE ORDER OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM COUNCIL  
(Position of the Tohono O'odham Nation  
on the Iraq-Kuwait Situation)

LEGISLATIVE ORDER NO. 91-025

1 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council is cognizant of the  
2 current situation involving the brutal and illegal  
3 occupation of the sovereign nation of Kuwait by the nation  
4 of Iraq; and

5 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council views Iraq's act  
6 of aggression, the invasion and continued occupation of  
7 the nation of Kuwait, an act which without a diplomatic  
8 resolve will initiate the destruction of the world; and

9 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council is concerned for  
10 the lives and well-being of its members serving in the  
11 United States Armed Forces currently stationed in Saudi  
12 Arabia; and

13 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council is aware of the  
14 current congressional debate on the probability of  
15 declaring war and authorizing the use of force to resolve  
16 the Iraq-Kuwait situation; and

17 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council supports the belief  
18 that the continued application of international and  
19 diplomatic efforts to pressure Iraq to leave Kuwait is the  
20 wisest course of action at this time and should be  
21 sustained.


22 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative  
23 Council that it is in the best interest of the Tohono  
24 O'odham Nation to notify George Bush, President of the  
25 United States and the United States Congress of its  
26 support in the continued application of international and  
27 diplomatic efforts to pressure Iraq out of the sovereign  
28 nation of Kuwait.

1 The foregoing Order was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council on the  
2 11th. day of January, 1991 at a meeting at which a quorum was  
3 present with a vote of 1,724.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting;  
4 01 absent, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section  
5 1 c(2) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham  
6 Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986,  
7 and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian  
8 Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of  
9 the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
