5 LEGISLATIVE ORDER NO. 91-035

6 WHEREAS, the Sif Oidak District did by the enactment of Resolution  
7 18-90 bring to the attention of the Legislative Council  
8 various concerns regarding the upcoming O'odham Tash;  
9 and


10 WHEREAS, additional concerns were raised by the Council regarding  
11 the usage of the name "O'odham Tash", stringent  
12 regulations imposed upon Food Sellers, and various acts  
13 of discrimination by the City of Casa Grande; and


14 WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the Nation that these  
15 concerns be referred to the Cultural Preservation  
16 Committee of the Legislature for mediation and  
17 resolution.

18 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDERED, BY THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE  
19 COUNCIL that the concerns raised by the Legislative  
20 Council regarding the usage of the name "O'odham Tash",  
21 stringent regulations imposed upon Food Sellers, and  
22 various acts of discrimination by the City of Casa  
23 Grande, as well as those outlined in the Sif Oidak  
24 District Resolution # 18-90, "Requesting support on the  
25 concerns upcoming O'odham Tash event", be referred to  
26 the Cultural Preservation Committee of the Legislature  
27 for mediation and resolution.

11 O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18,  
12 1986, and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary -  
13 Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section  
14 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
