

RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL  
(Supporting Sobriety Planning Committee)

RES. NO. 91-093

1 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'Odham Nation Legislative Council passed  
2 Resolution 264-89, for Certification of a Drug Free  
3 Workplace; and

4 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'Odham Nation does endorse and adopt all of  
5 the provisions of P. L. 100-690 (Title V, Sub-title D);  
6 and

7 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'Odham Nation does adopt and implement the  
8 "Policy Regarding Alcohol and Drugs"; and

9 WHEREAS, a presentation was given to the Legislative Council on  
10 November 9, 1990 for discussion on the Tohono O'Odham  
11 Gathering for Sobriety; and

12 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'Odham Nation Sobriety Planning Committee has  
13 organized the Gathering for Sobriety which is set for  
14 April 12, 13, and 14, 1991. The theme for this event is:  
15 Unity, Wellness, Spirituality, Sobriety and Peace; and

16 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'Odham Nation is in danger of losing what is  
17 very important to us, our culture, our traditions, our  
18 identity as O'Odham because of the use of alcohol and  
19 substance abuse among our people; and

20 WHEREAS, the purpose of this Run is to bring Sobriety Awareness to  
21 the Tohono O'Odham Nation members. A gathering of people  
22 helping people toward a better way of life without alcohol  
23 or substance abuse will be shared by friends and families,  
24 as well as those who will be coming from other various  
25 tribal entities to participate in activities; and

26 WHEREAS, the activities for the event are attached hereto.

27 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'Odham Nation does  
28 support the Tohono O'Odham Gathering for Sobriety.

1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Nation does promote:

- 2 - awareness to establish and maintain a safe, and
- 3 health environment for its people
- 4 - a positive reputation of its citizens as productive,
- 5 and responsible members
- 6 - to reduce the incidence of injury to persons or
- 7 property
- 8 - to provide assistance for rehabilitation for wellness
- 9 of its members.

10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Nation shall request  
11 the Executive Chairman to sign a "Proclamation" supporting  
12 the Tohono O'odham Gathering for Sobriety '91.

13 The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council  
14 on the 7th day of March, 1991 at a meeting at which a quorum was  
15 present with a vote of 1,667.0 for; -0- against; 57.0 not voting;  
16 03 absent, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section  
17 1(c)(2)(8) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham  
18 Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986,  
19 and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian  
20 Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of  
21 the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
