2	WHEREAS,	in May 1988, the Tohono O'odham Nation purchased 2,910
3		acres of land in Pinal County (the "San Lucy Farm")

6	WHEREAS,	the San Lucy Farm meets the requirements prescribed in the

13	WHEREAS,	Bureau of Indian Affairs ("BIA") and other officials

15	1	and verbally that the San Lucy Farm constitutes part of
16	}	the Nation's trust lands; and
17		an attorney for the Secretary has confirmed in writing

17 WHEREAS, an attorney for the Secretary has confirmed in writing
18 that the San Lucy Farm is trust land which is exempt from
19 taxation, or assessments in lieu of taxes, imposed by the
20 Central Arizona Irrigation and Drainage District (the
21 "Irrigation District"), a political subdivision of the
22 State; and

WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Farming Authority (the "Farm
 Authority") erroneously paid assessments in lieu of real
 property taxes imposed by the Irrigation District for 1988
 and 1989 in the total amount of \$55,401.12; and

NO. <u>91-112</u> (Authorizing the Attorney General to File a Law Suit to Prevent Interruption of Water Deliveries to the San Lucy Farm) Page (2) 1 2 WHEREAS, the Irrigation District has issued to the Farm Authority 3 an assessment in lieu of real property taxes for 1990 in 4 the amount of \$218,541; and 5 WHEREAS, the San Lucy Farm is Nation trust lands by operation of 6 law; and 7 WHEREAS, under the Act, the United States has the obligation to pay 8 all assessments for 1988, 1989, 1990 and future years; 9 and WHEREAS, by letters dated March 21, 1991, the Nation's Attorney 10 11 General informed both the BIA and Irrigation District that 12 the United States was liable for payment of such 13 assessments, and demanded that the Untied States remit 14 payment immediately; and WHEREAS, the BIA has requested a formal opinion from the Interior 15 16 Department's Office of Solicitor concerning the trust 17 status of the San Lucy Farm and the United States' 18 liability for payment of in lieu assessments thereon; and WHEREAS, the Solicitor's opinion is not expected to be completed 19 20 until April 17, 1991; and WHEREAS, payment of the first installment of the 1990 assessment 21 22 is due on or before April 8, 1991; and WHEREAS, by letter to the Nation's Attorney General dated March 29, $\mathbf{23}$ 24 1991, the attorneys for the Irrigation District threatened 25 to terminate water delivery to the San Lucy Farm if the 26 first installment of the assessment is not paid by April 27 8, 1991; and 28

The Tohono O'odham Legislative Council hereby 12 authorizes the Attorney General to take all necessary 13 legal actions, including initiation of a law suit on 14 behalf of the Tohono O'odham Nation in federal court 15 or any other court or forum of competent jurisdiction, 16 to (a) secure a determination that the United States 17 is liable for payment of the Irrigation District's 18 assessments in lieu of taxes on the San Lucy Farm for 19 1988, 1989, 1990 and future years and (b) prevent 20 interruption of water deliveries to the San Lucy Farm 21 for failure of the United States to pay such 22 assessments. 23 The Attorney General shall keep the Legislative 2. 24 Council, Chairman of the Nation, San Lucy District 25 Council and the Tohono O'odham Farming Authority **2**6 informed concerning actions taken pursuant to this 27 Resolution. 28
