WHEREAS, the Indian Self-Determination Act was amended pursuant to P.L. 100-472, on September 30, 1988; and

WHEREAS, one provision of those amendments to the Indian SelfDetermination Act, Section 107(b) provides that the
Secretary of Interior and the Secretary of Health and
Human Services are to promulgate regulations, with the
participation of Indian tribes to implement the
amendments; and

WHEREAS, the legislative history, specifically Senate Report No. 100-274 provides that Indian tribes and organizations are to "actively participate" in the preparation of new regulations (See Page 38 of the Report excerpt attached); and

WHEREAS, the process for development of the new regulations have proceeded for two plus years, with activities coordinated by the Bureau of Indian Affairs and Indian Health Services, for each department, and Indian Tribes; and

WHEREAS, Representatives of the Tohono O'Odham Nation have been informed that the regulations required under the Act as noted above are now undergoing review and amendment by the Department of Interior and the Department of Health and Human Services, and without tribal input and participation in these developments; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Council of the Tohono O'Odham Nation hereby directs the Chairman of the Legislative Council in coordination with the Chairman of the Nation to pursue as they jointly deem necessary with Secretary's the continued the respective active participation in the regulation development processes now ongoing in each Department, and to take such other steps as they deem necessary and appropriate to ensure the development of meaningful and appropriate regulations to implement the Indian Self-Determination Act as amended,
