WHEREAS, prior to May 1988, the Nation requested that, upon acquisition of the San Lucy Farm, the Secretary of Interior place the lands in trust for the Nation; and

WHEREAS, under Section 7(a) of the Act the Secretary of Interior (the "Secretary") is required to pay all assessments "in lieu of real property taxes" to the State of Arizona and its political subdivisions; and

WHEREAS, the Central Arizona Irrigation and Drainage District (the "Irrigation District") is a political subdivision of the State of Arizona; and

WHEREAS, the Tohono O'Odham Farming Authority (the "Farm Authority") erroneously paid assessments in lieu of real property taxes imposed by the Irrigation District for 1988 and 1989 in the total amount of \$55,401.12; and

WHEREAS, the Irrigation District has issued to the Farm Authority an assessment in lieu of real property taxes for 1990 in the amount of \$218,541.; and
