

RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Expressing Gratitude and Appreciation for Congressman Morris K.
Udall Upon his Retirement from the U.S. House of Representatives)

2 WHEREAS, on April 19, 1991, Morris K. Udall announced his retire-
3 ment from the House of Representatives effective May 4,
4 1991, after 30 years service to the Second District of
5 Arizona and the United States; and

6 WHEREAS, Congressman Udall has been the Chairman of the House of
7 Interior & Insular Affairs Committee which Committee has
8 the primary House oversight role with Indian Affairs; and

9 WHEREAS, Congressman Udall, has consistently supported and
10 advocated, on behalf of the Tohono O'odham Nation and all
11 American Indians and Alaskan Native Groups, to ensure that
12 the Federal government's dealings with Native Americans
13 have developed in such a manner to maximize the opportun-
14 ities for tribes to realize true self-determination; and

15 WHEREAS, Congressman Udall, in his dealings with the O'odham people
16 and all others, has consistently demonstrated the highest
17 integrity, candor and compassion, in the tradition of a
18 true American Statesman.

19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislative Council of the
20 Tohono O'odham Nation, expresses its sincere gratitude and
21 appreciation upon the retirement of Morris K. Udall from
22 the United States House of Representatives, for his
23 service to the Nation, the State of Arizona and all
24 Americans.

25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Council of the Tohono
26 O'odham Nation on behalf of the Nation and its members
27 conveys its concern for Congressman Udall and wishes him
28 a full and speedy recovery.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Legislative Council of the Tohono O'odham Nation further expresses that the Nation will sorely miss Congressman Udall's active representation and support of the Nation's initiatives but hopes and desires to continue the mutual friendship we have developed over the years of our interaction.

The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council on the 22nd day of April, 1991 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1,724.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; 05 absent, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section 1(1) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986, and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
