## RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL (Recommendations of Water Resources Committee on Recharge, 9B Farm and Other Alternatives)

1 RES. NO. 91-180 2 WHEREAS, Council Resolution No. 91-103 extended to April 30, 1991 3 the recommendations of the Water Resources Committee (the "Committee") regarding recharge, the 9B Farm and other 5 alternatives for use of the Central Arizona Project 6 ("CAP") water granted under the Southern Arizona Water 7 Rights Settlement Act ("SAWRSA"); and 8 WHEREAS, the Committee has provided the Legislative Council with 9 a status report on each of the five tasks identified in 10 Council Resolution No. 206-90; and 11 WHEREAS, the feasibility study on the 9B Farm has been completed; 12 and 13 WHEREAS, the recharge feasibility study has been completed; and 14 WHEREAS, the Committee has provided copies of the studies to the 15 Schuk Toak District Council, San Xavier District Council, 16 and representatives of the San Xavier Allottees for their 17 review and comment; and 18 WHEREAS, the consultants made presentations of their studies to the 19 Legislative Council at a Special Session on April 30, 20 1991, at which representatives of the Districts and 21 allottees were in attendance; and 22 WHEREAS, based on the results of the 9B recharge studies and **2**3 independent assessments by the Committee, several options 24 have been identified for use of the CAP water, many of 25 which are interrelated; and 26 WHEREAS, the Committee has determined that certain options deserve 27 further analysis in order to identify the full range of 28

NO. 91-180 (Recommendations of Water Resources Committee on Recharge, 9B Farm and Other Alternatives) Page (2) 1 2 viable alternatives of CAP water use before the Committee 3 makes its final recommendations; and 4 WHEREAS, the Committee has met with the allottee representatives 5 discuss their concerns, including eight to items 6 identified in a document dated October 25, 1990; and 7 WHEREAS, the Nation's Attorney General, at the request of the 8 Committee, has prepared and submitted for Committee review 9 an outline of possible SAWRSA amendments and other actions 10 by the Nation which address the allottee concerns as well 11 as other deficiencies in SAWRSA; and **12** WHEREAS, following further Committee consideration, it is the 13 Committee's intention to present the outline to the 14 Districts and allottees for discussion ad comment; and 15 WHEREAS, the Committee is aware of the time constraints associated 16 with a final settlement of the Nation's water rights under 17 SAWRSA, while at the same time recognizing that this may 18 be the last opportunity to clarify SAWRSA and great care 19 must therefore be exercised in exploring all options and 20 their implications; and 21 WHEREAS, following a review of the studies, consultation with the 22 authors of the studies, consideration of the comments of 23 the Districts, allottees, Council members and other 24 officials of the Nation, the Committee has adopted the 25 recommendations set forth below. 26 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative 27 Council that: 28
