

RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL  
(Supporting Indian Housing Authority Application  
for New Housing Units and Request for Planning Funds)

1  
2 WHEREAS, it is the policy of this locality to eliminate  
3 substandard and other inadequate housing, to prevent  
4 the spread of slums and blight, and to realize as soon  
5 as feasible the goal of a decent home in a suitable  
6 living environment for all of its citizens; and

7 WHEREAS, under the provisions of the United States Housing Act  
8 of 1937, as amended, the United States of America,  
9 acting through the Secretary of Housing and Urban  
10 Development (herein called the "Government"), is  
11 authorized to provide financial assistance to local  
12 public housing agencies for undertaking and carrying  
13 out preliminary planning of low-income housing projects  
14 that will assist in meeting this goal; and

15 WHEREAS, Section 213 of the Housing and Community Development  
16 Act of 1974 provides that the local unit of government  
17 be given the opportunity to comment on and/or object  
18 to the approval of an application on grounds of  
19 inconsistency with local housing assistance planning;  
20 and

21 WHEREAS, the ultimate responsibility for the administration and  
22 maintenance of reservation roads rests with the local  
23 tribal government; and

24 WHEREAS, the local housing authority is a public body and the  
25 property of the local housing authority is declared to  
26 be public property used for essential public and  
27 governmental purposes; and

2 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'Odham Indian Housing Authority (herein  
3 called "Local Authority") is a public housing agency  
4 and is applying to the Government for a grant to cover  
5 the costs of surveys and planning in connection with  
6 the development of low-income housing.

7 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative  
8 Council:

- 10 1. That there exists within the jurisdiction of this  
11 Governing Council a need for such low-income housing  
12 which is not being met by private enterprise.
  - 13 2. That the application of the Local Authority to the  
14 Government for a grant in an amount not to exceed  
15 3 percent of the Total Development Cost which can  
16 be supported by the amount of the ACC for surveys  
17 and planning in connection with low-income housing  
18 projects of not to exceed approximately 50  
19 dwelling units is hereby approved.
  - 20 3. That there is no objection to the Local Authority's  
21 application to HUD for additional housing, (a) due  
22 to any inconsistency with a HUD-approved Housing  
23 Assistance Plan for the locality or localities under  
24 consideration; or (b) since a definite need for the  
25 housing exists even though a Housing Assistance Plan  
26 may not be in effect; and (c) since public  
27 facilities and services are or will be available and  
28 adequate to serve the proposed housing in the areas  
mentioned.
  4. That the Indian Housing Authority will proceed with  
the project as acquisition of existing housing or  
rehabilitation as required by paragraph 6(H) of the  
Act, if the Field Office determines as a result of  
HUD review of the submitted cost comparison (or  
insufficient existing housing) documentation that  
rehabilitation or acquisition of existing housing  
would cost less than new construction (or that  
sufficient existing housing is available).
  5. Upon dedication by the local housing authority of  
roads contained within completed housing projects  
funded under the United States Housing Act of 1937,  
as amended, the Tohono O'Odham Nation shall accept  
the said project streets into the local street and  
highway system.

6. By this resolution the Tohono O'odham Nation hereby requests that the Bureau of Indian Affairs add the streets and roads to the Federal Aid Indian Road System for maintenance pursuant to 25 CFR paragraph 170.6.


The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council on the 23rd day of May, 1991 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1,724.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; 04 absent, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section 1(e) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986, and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).






