

RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Recommendations regarding the Papago Livestock Complex)

RES. NO. 91-249

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2 WHEREAS, the Legislative Health & Human Services Committee has
3 brought concerns to the Legislative Council regarding
4 the health, environmental, and safety conditions of the
5 Papago Livestock Complex; and

6 WHEREAS, the Committee has submitted documentation to the
7 Legislative Council regarding the status of the existing
8 conditions, specifically the comprehensive health and
9 safety surveys conducted by the Indian Health Services
10 Environmental Services Branch; and

11 WHEREAS, the deficiencies condition reports include: structural
12 and functional design, plumbing, water troughs,
13 ventilation, lighting, and solid waste (including animal
14 carcasses and manure pilings); and

15 WHEREAS, the committee is aware of potential administrative
16 conditions relating to liability insurance coverage for
17 which the Nation could be held liable; and

18 WHEREAS, use of the Livestock Complex for activities of interest
19 to O'odham, other tribes and non-Indians continues to
20 increase; and

21 WHEREAS, the Committee is concerned for the health, safety and
22 welfare of the public and has made specific
23 recommendations to the Council.

24 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative
25 Council that it does support the following recommenda-
26 tions of the Health & Human Services Committee:
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1. A complete renovation of the Livestock Complex be done, including construction of approximately 15 permanent food booths with proper lighting and clean-up facilities.
2. The Executive Office of the Nation be involved in this effort to coordinate with the Research & Planning Department, Indian Health Services Environmental Branch and the Livestock Complex management.
3. That a comprehensive cost estimate be obtained on all aspects to renovate and correct deficiencies of the Livestock Complex.
4. Every effort should be made to expedite needed repairs, renovation and clean-up within the next four months.
5. Consideration be given to temporarily curtail activities constituting a danger to participants of activities until deficiencies are corrected.
6. The Tohono O'odham Legislative Council will be kept updated on the efforts and progress on a monthly basis.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that funds needed to correct the health and safety deficiencies shall be appropriated upon submission of a proper and justifiable budget by the Executive Office of the Tohono O'odham Nation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that additional recommendations will be developed by other appropriate oversight committees of the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council within 30 days of the enactment of this resolution and that said recommendations be forwarded to the full Council for action.

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The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council on the 6th day of June, 1991 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1,610.0 for; 57.0 against; 57.0 not voting; 02 absent, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section 1 (2) and (d) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986, and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
