6	WHEREAS,	the reorganization raises much concern on the major impact
7		it will have on the education system in the B.I.A. funded
8		schools; and
9	WHEREAS,	the United States Government has already mandated under
10		P.L. 93-638, P.L. 95-561 and P.L. 100-297 that Indian
11		Tribes shall determine their own education direction and
12		that the Bureau of Indian Affairs shall carry out the
13		laws; and
14	WHEREAS,	the B.I.A.'s task force is considering to reorganize its
15		structure back to a system of the past that did not work
16		in its existence, and which, if implemented, will severely
17		jeopardize the progress that Indian Nations have made
18		since the passage of P.L. 93-638; and
19	WHEREAS,	the B.I.A. School Boards have also been made aware of the
20		Draft Audit of P.L. 95-561 Implementation Report, done by
21		the Office of the Interior's Inspector General which
<b>22</b>		states, "only four (4) of the 17 principle provisions have
<b>2</b> 3		been implemented"; and

13	Boarding School and Santa Rosa Ranch School Boards
14	opposing B.I.A. reorganization.
15	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council
16	strongly opposes any attempts to repeal P.L. 95-561, due
17	to the belief that Indian education should remain under
18	the control of Indian People.
19	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council
20	supports extensive active consultation and/or correspon-
21	dence with the Tohono O'odham Nation by any task force,
22	steering committee, etc., which is directly responsible
23	for any proposed changes effecting the education, not only
24	of Tohono O'odham students, but the over all Indian
25	population, prior to making final decisions.
