NO. 91-316  $\mathbf{2}$ the Tohono O'Odham Nation is presently operating the WHEREAS. 3 Tohono O'Odham Career Center Program; and 4 WHEREAS, the Department of Education has announced that the 5 supplemental appropriations act enacted on April 10. 6 1991 (P. L. 102-27) to provide grants for the operation 7 and improvement of tribally controlled post-secondary 8 vocational institutions to ensure continued and 9 expanded educational opportunities for Indian students; 10 and 11 the Secretary intends to distribute all funds available WHEREAS, 12 under this program through this competitive grant 13 process for a project period of three years; and 14 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'Odham Nation Career Center has submitted 15 an application for federal assistance for a three year 16 grant with the U.S. Department of Education Office of 17 Vocational and Adult Education; and 18 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council is desirous to 19 continue to provide a vocational and education training 20 program to Native Americans; and 21 WHEREAS. the Tohono O'Odham Career Center has submitted for 22 review and approval the first year application and **2**3 budget in the amount of \$204,016.00 for FY 1992. 24 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative 25 Council that it does hereby approve the Tohono O'Odham 26 Nation Career Center application and budget for federal 27 assistance in order to continue to provide a Vocational 28 Indian Education Program for Native Americans.
