

1 LEGISLATIVE ORDER OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM COUNCIL
2 (Amending Council's Agenda - July 11, 1991)

3 LEGIS. ORDER NO. 91-318

4 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council reviewed their
5 agenda established for the July 11, 1991 General
6 Session; and

7 WHEREAS, pursuant to Article III, Section 5.A of the Legislative
8 Rules emergency items were requested for Council
9 consideration;

10 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative
11 Council that it hereby amends the agenda for the July
12 11, 1991 General Session to include the following

Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on
January 18, 1986, and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant
Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant
to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
