RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL (Appropriation for Vigida Delegation and other Officials to travel to Mexico City)

RES. NO. 91-320

WHEREAS, the officials of the traditional O'Odham Vigida Ceremony are in opposition of a proposal by the Mexican National Institute of Anthropology and History to establish an archeological zone in the Quitovac area which encompasses the sacred ceremonial site of the Vigida which if approved would jeopardize the continuation of one of the most sacred ceremonies of the Nation and enable further archaeologic, environmental, economic and political exploitation of the area by the non-O'odham; and

WHEREAS, the officials of the Vigida are primarily residents of the Gu Vo District and have sought and received resolutions of support from the Al Ce:k Community, and the Gu Vo District, respectively, and;

whereas, the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council is empowered by the Tohono O'odham Nation's Constitution "to preserve and cultivate native arts, crafts, and traditions" of the O'Odham, further, the Legislative Council in recognizing that Vigida ceremony has great cultural, ancestral, and religious significance for the O'Odham's survival as a people as well as that of the non-O'odham throughout the world, did enact Resolution No. 91-203 supporting and endorsing the request of the Vigida officials in having direct communication with the President of Mexico, Carlos Salinas de Gortari, to express their concerns to preserve the Vigida ceremonial site; to gain the Mexican government's assurance that the site will remain
