

RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Child Care Block Grant)

2 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation is presently operating the Early
3 Childhood Head Start Program, Day Care Center for its
4 young members by providing for their welfare through
5 various programs and services designed to meet their
6 special needs; and

7 WHEREAS, the Department of Health and Human Services,
8 Administration for Children and Family has announced that
9 supplemental appropriations under the Omnibus Budget
10 Reconciliation Act of 1990, P.L. 101-508, established a
11 new Child Care and Development Block Grant Program to
12 provide grants to tribal government to administer child
13 care programs; and

14 WHEREAS, P.L. 101-508 of the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of
15 1990, section 5082, provides provision that the Secretary
16 shall reserve not more than 3 percent of the amount
17 appropriated in each fiscal year for payments to Indian
18 tribes and tribal organizations; and

19 WHEREAS, the primary purpose of the block grant is to assist states
20 to provide child care services to low-income, working
21 families, (The Family Support Act requires child care
22 services for AFDC parents who are participating in the
23 JOBS training, and for one year after obtaining
24 employment); and

25 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation early Childhood Headstart
26 Program has submitted a proposed budget under this program
27 through this competitive block grant; and

2 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council is desirous to
3 continue to provide Day Care Services to its young tribal
4 members; and

5 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation Early Childhood Headstart
6 Program has submitted for review and approval the proposed
7 budget in the amount of \$186,775.00.

8 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative
9 Council that it does hereby approves the Tohono O'odham
10 Nation Early Childhood Headstart Program budget for
11 federal assistance in order to supplement Day Care
12 Services to its young tribal members.

13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council
14 that the Tohono O'odham Nation's Officials, to wit; the
15 Chairman, Vice Chairman and any designed official are
16 hereby authorized to negotiate and execute the grant,
17 provided however, that any amendments affecting the
18 funding or funding levels of the grant shall be submitted
19 for further prior approval by this Council.

20 The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council
21 on the 11th. day of July, 1991 at a meeting at which a quorum was
22 present with a vote of 1,724.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting;
23 02 absent, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section
24 1(f) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham
25 Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986,
26 and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian
27 Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of
28 the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
