(The Establishment of the Tohono O'odham Community Based Human  
Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) Education Proposal)**

3 **WHEREAS,** *the Tohono O'odham Nation seeks to provide the best quality of life*  
4 *possible for the tribal members and in particular it seeks to keep them*  
5 *free from the epidemic of AIDS caused by the Human*  
6 *Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV); and*

7 **WHEREAS,** *AIDS caused by the HIV has no cure and can be spread by people*  
8 *who do not even know they are infected causing death to men,*  
9 *women and infants; and*

10  
11 **WHEREAS,** *the Tohono O'odham Nation through the Tohono O'odham Health*  
12 *Department wishes to offer education programs to the young people*  
13 *of the Nation who are most at risk for acquiring HIV; and*

14 **WHEREAS,** *the Health Department has been requested by the Tohono O'odham*  
15 *Women, Infants and Children (WIC) services and the Bureau of Indian*  
16 *Affairs, Education Department to develop an education program to*  
17 *help their clients and students learn how to prevent the spread of this*  
18 *HIV epidemic; and*

20 **WHEREAS,** *the Arizona State Department of Health Services (ADHS) has offered*  
21 *a Request for Competitive Sealed Proposals (RFP) No. 2-229 for the*  
22 *purpose of funding contracts to Tribal Governments or Community*  
23 *Based Organization which serves and/or represents racial and/or ethnic*  
24 *minorities for the performance of HIV education; and*

25  
26 **WHEREAS,** *the Tohono O'odham Health Department's Community Health Services*  
27 *has prepared a proposal for submission to the Arizona State*  
28 *Department of Health Services for funding.*

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that it does hereby approve the Tohono O'odham community Based HIV Education Proposal for submission.**

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the duration of the contract is proposed for the term of award, January 01, 1992 through December 31, 1995, with annual submissions of budgets.**

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that the Tohono O'odham Nation's officials, to wit; the Chairman, Vice Chairman and any designated officials are hereby authorized to negotiate and execute the contract, provided however, that any amendments affecting the funding or funding levels of this contract shall be submitted for further prior approval by this council.**

**The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council on the 9th day of October, 1991 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1,546.5 FOR; -0- AGAINST; 63.5 NOT VOTING; and 114.0 (04) ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section 1 (f) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).**
