## RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL (Reaffirming Civil and Criminal Jurisdiction Over San Lucy Farm)

2	WHEREAS,	in 1988, the Tohono O'odham Nation purchased the Schramm Ranch
3		(now known as the San Lucy Farm) as the initial acquisition of lands
5		under the Gila Bend Indian Reservation Lands Replacement Act, P.L.
6		99-503 (The "Act") to replace the Reservation lands made unusable
7		due to flooding caused by the Painted Rock Dam; and
8	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Nation asserts and maintains that the San Lucy
9		Farm is tribal trust land, as contemplated by Section 6(d) of the Act;
10		and
11	WHEREAS,	as trust lands, the San Lucy Farm is within the territorial jurisdiction
12		•
13		of the Nation for purposes of applying the Nation's civil and criminal
14		laws; and
15	WHEREAS,	on October 9, 1991, an incident occurred at the San Lucy Farm which
16		was investigated by the Tohono O'odham Police Department; and
17	WHEREAS,	as a result of that investigation, Tribal Police officers arrested and
18 19		placed in detention an O'odham individual; and
20	WHEREAS,	the alleged victim is a non-member Indian; and
21	WHEREAS,	the Pinal County Sheriff's Office also investigated the incident and has
22		requested Tribal Police authorities to release the suspect to them; and
23	WHEREAS,	State and County law enforcement authorities have no legal
24		jurisdiction to arrest and/or prosecute O'odham individuals accused of
25		
26		criminal acts on Tribal lands; and
27	WHEREAS,	protection of the Nation's civil and criminal jurisdiction is essential to
28		preserve the Nation's sovereignty and right of self-government.

3	Nation, the Legislative Council hereby reaffirms and asserts:							
4	(1) the Nation's civil and criminal jurisdiction over the lands of the

6	San Lucy Farm and activities thereon,							
7	(2) the Nation's criminal jurisdiction over the subject incident, and							
8	(3) the complete absence of State or County jurisdiction over the							
9	subject incident.

11	The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council of the 10th. day of OCT., 1991 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1,495.5 FOR; -0- AGAINST; 62.5 NOT VOTING; and 166.0 [7] ABSENT pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section 1 () of Article VI of the
