

**RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(FY 1993 Children's Home Recontract Proposal)**

RES. NO. 92-222

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3 **WHEREAS, the Tohono O'Odham Nation is presently operating the Children's**
4 **Home Program under FY 1992 P. L. 93-638 contract with the**
5 **Bureau of Indian Affairs; and**

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7 **WHEREAS, such tribal operations have been successful and beneficial to the**
8 **Tohono O'Odham Nation and its people; and**

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10 **WHEREAS, 25 CFR 271.20 of the Code of Federal Regulations requires that**
11 **all proposals to recontract under P. L. 93-638 be submitted to the**
12 **Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council for approval at least 120**
13 **days prior to the current contract termination; and**

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15 **WHEREAS, the Tohono O'Odham Nation does desire to recontract for**
16 **provision of services during FY 1993; and**

17 **WHEREAS, the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council has reviewed and**
18 **approved the FY 1993 Children's Home contract proposal and**
19 **budgets.**

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21 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative**
22 **Council that it does authorize and request the Bureau of Indian**
23 **Affairs to recontract with the Tohono O'Odham Nation under**
24 **P. L. 93-638 regulations and procedures for the provision of**
25 **services titled: Children's Home Program.**

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28 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the duration of this recontract shall**

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3 *commence on October 01, 1992 through September 30, 1993.*

4 ***BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED*** by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council that
5 *the Tohono O'Odham Nation will not fund or operate the*
6 *program in the interim while negotiations are still being*
7 *conducted and no executed contract has been approved by the*
8 *Bureau of Indian Affairs, unless the agency authorizes and*
9 *approves pre-award costs consistent with the Indian Self-*
10 *Determination Act, as amended and relevant contract regulations.*

13 ***BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED*** by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council that
14 *the Tohono O'Odham Nation's Officials, to wit: the Chairman,*
15 *Vice Chairman and any designated official are hereby authorized*
16 *to negotiate and execute the contract, provided however, that any*
17 *amendments affecting the funding or funding levels of the*
18 *contract shall be submitted for further prior approval by this*
19 *Council.*

23 *The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative*
24 *Council on the 3RD day of June, 1992 at a meeting at which a quorum was*
25 *present with a vote of 1,645.0 FOR; -0- AGAINST; 79.0 NOT VOTING;*
26 *and 02 ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section 1 (f)*
27 *of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the*
28 *Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting*
Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986,
pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
