

**RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(FY 1993 Title II-B Employment Training Program Grant
Proposal with the U.S. Department of Labor)**

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3 **WHEREAS, the Job Training Partnership Act was enacted into law in 1982**
4 **replacing Comprehensive Employment Training Act (CETA); and**

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6 **WHEREAS, the Job Training Partnership Act (JTPA) funds are made**
7 **available to State and Tribal governments from the United States**
8 **Department of Labor to establish employment and training**
9 **programs for improving the employment prospects of eligible**
10 **persons; and**

11
12 **WHEREAS, Indian Reservations in Arizona have been designated as service**
13 **delivery areas and are eligible to receive Federal JTPA funds; and**

14
15 **WHEREAS, the Nation is entitled to JTPA funds to develop a network of**
16 **employment training programs throughout the Nation; and**

17 **WHEREAS, the Tohono O'Odham Nation has operated the Title II-B**
18 **programs since 1974; and**

20 **WHEREAS, the JTPA Program has submitted for review and approval for the**
21 **Title II-B Contract Proposal for Fiscal Year 1993, which includes:**

- 22 - **Summer Youth Annual Plan;**
23 - **FY 1993 Administrative Cost Pool Budget in the amount of**
24 **\$24,387.00; and**
25 - **FY 1993 Program Budget in the amount of \$97,548.00;**
26 **For a Grand Total amount of \$121,935.00.**

27 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative**
28 **Council that it hereby approves the Summer Youth Annual Plan**

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3 *and the Title II-B Budget in the amount of \$121,935 for the*
4 *delivery of JTPA services.*

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6 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** *that the duration of the grant shall be from*
7 *October 01, 1992 through September 30, 1993.*

8 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** *by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council that*
9 *the Tohono O'Odham Nation will not fund or operate the*
10 *program in the interim while negotiations are still being*
11 *conducted and no executed grant has been awarded by the United*
12 *States Department of Labor.*

14 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** *by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council that*
15 *the Tohono O'Odham Nation's Officials to wit: the Chairman,*
16 *Vice-Chairman, and any designated official are hereby authorized*
17 *to negotiate and execute the grant, provided, however, that any*
18 *amendments affecting the funding or funding levels of this grant*
19 *shall be submitted for further prior approval by this Council.*

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23 *The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative*
24 *Council on the 4TH day of June, 1992 at a meeting at which a quorum was*
25 *present with a vote of 1,558.0 FOR; -0- AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and*
26 *166.0 [08] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section*
27 *1 (f) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted*
28 *by the Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the*
Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6,
1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
