

RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Supporting Continuation of Study on Flood Control
for Lower Santa Cruz River)

3 **WHEREAS,** *the United States Corps of Engineers and the Pinal County Flood*
4 *Control District have conducted a joint study to determine the feasibility*
5 *of a flood control project for the Lower Santa Cruz River; and*

6
7 **WHEREAS,** *continuation of the study is required to determine whether diversion of*
8 *the floodwaters to the Tat Momolikot Dam is a feasible option to reduce*
9 *flood damages; and*

10
11 **WHEREAS,** *the Corps of Engineers and Pinal County have requested the support*
12 *of the Sif Oidak District and Tohono O'odham Nation for continuation*
13 *of the study, without financial obligation on the part of the District or*
14 *Nation; and*

16 **WHEREAS,** *the floodwaters of the Santa Cruz River have historically caused*
17 *extensive damage to the buildings and lands of the Sif Oidak District,*
18 *particularly in the Chuichu area; and*

19
20 **WHEREAS,** *storage of the floodwaters behind the Tat Momolikot Dam may provide*
21 *a valuable water resource to the District; and*

22 **WHEREAS,** *the Sif Oidak District supports continuation of the flood control study,*
23 *as evidenced by the District Council's Resolution attached hereto.*

24 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:**

26 *1. The Tohono O'odham Legislative Council hereby expresses its*
27 *support for the continuation of the flood control study.*

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2. *The Legislative Council's support is subject to agreement by the Corps of Engineers and Pinal County on the following conditions:*

(a) *Neither the Sif Oidak District nor the Tohono O'odham Nation shall be required to commit funds or in-kind services;*

(b) *Representatives of the District and Nation shall be designated as active and full participants in all meetings associated with the study and shall have access to all study documents and materials; and*

(c) *In the absence of the authorized written consent of the District and Nation, the District and Nation shall not be bound by the conclusions or recommendations of the study.*

The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council on the 9TH day of JULY, 1992 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1,335.0 FOR; 53.0 AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and 336.0 ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section 1 (i)(2) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).






