



BE IT FURTHER ORDERED that the "Contest of the Election Results in Chukut Kuk District" & "Rescheduling or extending the August General Session" are considered emergency items and will be addressed first before all other items scheduled for today.

The foregoing Legislative Order was passed by the Tohono O'odham Council on the 3RD. day of AUGUST, 1992 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1,503.0 FOR; -0- AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and 221.0 [09] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section 1 (a) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986, and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
