

**RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL**  
**(Authorizing Peace and Dignity Journeys 1992 usage**  
**of the Nation's Roads & Tohono O'odham Police Department)**

**RESOLUTION NO. 92-339**

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3 **WHEREAS,** *on May 02, 1992 a historic transcontinental run began titled the*  
4 *Peace and Dignity Journeys 1992; and*

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6 **WHEREAS,** *the Peace and Dignity Journeys will run through the state of*  
7 *Arizona entering from the State's western border; and*

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9 **WHEREAS,** *the Peace and Dignity Journeys organizers in the State of Arizona*  
10 *seeks the permission of the distinguished Tohono O'odham Nation*  
11 *for its passage through the Tohono O'odham Nation and for its*  
12 *local department of Public Safety (Tohono O'odham Police) to*  
13 *provide a escort for the runners throughout the O'odham Nation;*  
14 *and*

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17 **WHEREAS,** *the organizers and the Peace and Dignity Journeys organization*  
18 *does not and will not hold the Tohono O'odham Nation*  
19 *responsible for any disruption that may occur while on the lands*  
20 *of the Tohono O'odham; and*

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22 **WHEREAS,** *Peace and Dignity Journeys 1992 will comply with all laws,*  
23 *ordinances and codes of the Tohono O'odham Nation and do*  
24 *whatever is reasonable to ensure its fullest cooperation with the*  
25 *Tohono O'odham Nation.*

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27 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** *that the Tohono O'odham Legislative*  
28 *Council grants its permission to the Peace and Dignity Journey*

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3                    *1992 - transcontinental run to pass through the Tohono O'odham*  
4                    *Nation with designated rest stops along Federal Route 15, State*  
5                    *Highway 86 and designated routes to San Xavier.*

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7 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** *that the Chairman of the O'odham Nation*  
8                    *directs the Nation's Tohono O'odham Police Department to*  
9                    *provide for an escort for the runners/support vehicles once the*  
10                    *run enters upon the Tohono O'odham Nation and for the*  
11                    *duration of the run on O'odham lands.*

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14 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** *that the Tohono O'odham Nation's Chairman*  
15                    *or any other official of the Nation do whatever else the Nation*  
16                    *may deem necessary for the safety of the O'odham Nation and the*  
17                    *participants of the Peace and Dignity Journeys 1992 -*  
18                    *transcontinental run.*

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21 *The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative*  
22 *Council on the 12TH. day of AUGUST, 1992 at a meeting at which a quorum*  
23 *was present with a vote of 1,272.0 FOR; -0- AGAINST; 338.0 NOT VOTING;*  
24 *and 114.0 [04] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by*  
25 *Section 1 (c)(2) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham*  
26 *Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and*  
27 *approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations)*  
28 *on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.*  
*984).*
