3 **WHEREAS, the Department of Education, Office of Bilingual Education and**  
4 **Minority Languages Affairs has announced an invitation to**  
5 **apply for new awards under the Special Alternative**  
6 **Instructional Program; and**

9 **WHEREAS, Education has been and is a priority of the Tohono O'Odham**  
10 **Nation; and**

11 **WHEREAS, the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council is aware of the**  
12 **unique educational needs on the Tohono O'Odham Nation of**  
13 **which one is continuous English language development for all**  
14 **students; and**

17 **WHEREAS, historically, the student population has been in great need of**  
18 **alternative and supplemental instruction, specifically in science**  
19 **and math; and**

20  
21 **WHEREAS, the 21st Century requirements for success involve knowledge of**  
22 **high technology in all skills and is in alignment with the**  
23 **national goals in education; and**

25 **WHEREAS, the Tohono O'Odham Nation has education standards that**  
26 **govern the curriculum development at each school operating**  
27 **within the boundaries of the Tohono O'Odham Nation to**

3 ensure that Tohono O'Odham students meet state requirements,  
4 as well as the Tohono O'Odham standards.

6 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Tohono O'Odham  
7 **Legislative Council supports the Special Alternative**  
8 **Instructional Program as developed and submitted.**

9  
10 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the grant shall begin on July 01, 1993  
11 and end on June 30, 1994.

12  
13 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council  
14 that the Tohono O'Odham Nation's officials, to wit: the  
15 Chairman, Vice Chairman and any designated official are  
16 hereby authorized to negotiate and execute the grant, provided  
17 however, that any amendments affecting the funding or funding  
18 levels of the grant shall be submitted for further prior approval  
19 by this Council.

23 The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative  
24 Council on the 11TH. day of JANUARY, 1993 at a meeting at which a  
25 quorum was present with a vote of 1,724.0 FOR; -0- AGAINST; -0- NOT  
26 VOTING; and 07 ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by  
27 Section 1 (f) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation,  
28 adopted by the Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved  
by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on  
March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.  
984).
