

**RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Supporting a Referendum Petition on
Arizona Senate Bill 1001 and Authorizing
Financial Support for the Referendum Drive)**

RESOLUTION NO. 93-066

WHEREAS, the Nation has, for a number of years, been attempting to acquire a tribal-state gaming compact as required by the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act, 25 U.S.C. §§ 2701-2721 (IGRA); and

WHEREAS, through that process, the court-appointed mediator selected the Nation's last best offer for a compact as the proposal which best comports with the terms of IGRA; and

WHEREAS, in reaction to the mediator's selection, the Governor of Arizona sponsored legislation to modify Arizona's gambling laws (hereinafter referred to as "SB 1001") which was passed by the Arizona legislature by a very narrow margin; and

WHEREAS, the Governor's action in sponsoring and signing SB 1001 is a direct attack on the sovereignty of Indian Tribes, and is a repudiation of the government-to-government relationship between the Tribes located in Arizona and the State of Arizona; and

WHEREAS, neither the people of this State nor the Tribes of this State support the Governor's action or SB 1001; and

WHEREAS, the Intertribal Council of Arizona (ITCA) is sponsoring and/or supporting a referendum petition to put SB 1001 on the ballot

4 at the next general election in November 1994; and

5 **WHEREAS,** although SB 1001 is not a barrier to the Secretary of Interior
6 approving the range of gaming proposed by the Nation in its
7 last best offer for a tribal-state compact, the Nation does
8 support the efforts of ITCA and the citizens opposed to the
9 Governor's action in calling for a referendum on SB 1001.

12 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:**

- 13 1. The Nation supports the referendum petition on SB 1001.
14 2. The Nation authorizes expenditure of \$10,000 in support of
15 the referendum petition.
16 3. The Nation's contribution to the referendum petition is a
17 reasonable operating expense of Papago Bingo and shall be
18 paid by Papago Bingo.
19 4. The Nation's Vice Chairman, Sylvester Listo, is to
20 administer payment of the Nation's contribution to the
21 referendum petition.
22 5. The Nation shall require that periodic reports from ITCA
23 on the referendum petition be submitted to the Nation's
24 Vice Chairman and the Nation's Legislative Council.


