3 **WHEREAS, the Tohono O'Odham Nation has provided preventive health**  
4 **care for women, infants and children during Fiscal Year 1993;**

7 **WHEREAS, the Inter-Tribal Council of Arizona receives funds from the**  
8 **United States Department of Agriculture for programs designed**  
9 **to benefit women, infants and children; and**

11 **WHEREAS, the Tohono O'Odham Nation has entered into a Memorandum**  
12 **of Agreement with Inter-Tribal Council of Arizona to fund and**  
13 **operate the Women, Infants and Children (WIC) program; and**

14  
15 **WHEREAS, services provided to eligible clients have been beneficial and**  
16 **services continue to be necessary to help alleviate nutritional**  
17 **health risks and improve the health of individuals at risk.**

18  
19 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'Odham**  
20 **Legislative Council that it does hereby approve the application**  
21 **for funding from the Inter-Tribal Council of Arizona, to**  
22 **continue to operate and provide services to eligible women,**  
23 **infants and children.**

25 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the term of this Memorandum of**  
26 **Agreement will commence on October 01, 1993 through**

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council that the Tohono O'Odham Nation will not fund or operate the program in the interim while negotiations are still being conducted and no executed Agreement has been awarded by the Inter-Tribal Council of Arizona.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council that the Tohono O'Odham Nation's officials, to wit: the Chairman, and any designated official are hereby authorized to negotiate and execute the Memorandum of Agreement, provided however, that any amendments affecting the funding or funding levels of the Memorandum of Agreement shall be submitted for further prior approval by this Council.

The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council on the 8TH. day of JUNE, 1993 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1,763.0 FOR; -0- AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and 04 ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section 1 (f) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).


