

**RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(FY 1994 Law Enforcement and Detention Services/Anti Drug
Program Recontract Proposal)**

RESOLUTION NO. 93-196

WHEREAS, the Tohono O'Odham Nation is presently operating the Law Enforcement and Detention Services/Anti-Drug Program under an FY 1993 P. L. 93-638 contract with the Bureau of Indian Affairs; and

WHEREAS, such tribal operations have been successful and beneficial to the Tohono O'Odham Nation and its people; and

WHEREAS, 25 CFR 271.20 of the Code of Federal Regulations requires that all proposals to recontract under P. L. 93-638 be submitted to the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council for approval at least 120 days prior to the current contract termination; and

WHEREAS, the Tohono O'Odham Nation does desire to recontract for provision of services during FY 1994; and

WHEREAS, the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council has reviewed and approved the FY 1994 Law Enforcement and Detention Services/Anti-Drug Program contract proposal and budgets.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council that it does authorize and request the Bureau of Indian Affairs to recontract with the Tohono O'Odham Nation under P. L. 93-638 regulations and procedures for the provision of services titled: Law

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Enforcement and Detention Services.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the duration of this recontract shall commence on October 01, 1993 through September 30, 1994.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council that the Tohono O'Odham Nation will not fund or operate the program in the interim while negotiations are still being conducted and no executed contract has been approved by the Bureau of Indian Affairs, unless the agency authorizes and approves pre-award costs consistent with the Indian Self-Determination Act, as amended, and relevant contract regulations.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council that the Tohono O'Odham Nation's officials, to wit: the Chairman, and any designated official are hereby authorized to negotiate and execute the contract, provided however, that any amendments affecting the funding or funding levels of the contract shall be submitted for further prior approval by this Council.

The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council on the 9TH. day of JUNE, 1993 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1,763.0 FOR; -0- AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and



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
