## RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL (Accepting and Approving a Tribal-State Gaming Compact)

**RESOLUTION NO. 23-225** 

WHEREAS,	by Resolution No. <u>93-121</u> , the Legislative Council authorized
	and directed the Nation's Gaming Negotiating Committee to
	negotiate an agreement on behalf of the Nation pursuant to
	which class III gaming may be conducted within the Nation,
	giving due regard to the last best offer for a compact proposal
	approved by the Legislative Council and selected by the
	Mediator, the provisions of the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act,
	25 U.S.C. Sections 2701-2721, and other relevant factors and
	circumstances affecting the ability of the Nation to resume class
	III gaming; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 93-134, the Legislative Council authorized and directed the Nation's Gaming Negotiating Committee to finalize and execute an agreement in principle to implement the proposal of the Secretary of Interior for resolution of the class III gaming issue; and

WHEREAS, by letter dated May 12, 1993, the Chairman of the Nation transmitted to the Governor of Arizona the Gaming Negotiating Committee's proposed agreement in principle pursuant to which the Nation and the State would enter into a Tribal-State Gaming Compact upon the occurrence of the State's repeal of SB 1001,

the State's amendment of Arizona Revised Statutes Section 5-601 to ratify the Secretary of Interior's proposal, and the State's dismissal of its appeal in Yavapai-Prescott Indian Tribe. et al. v. State of Arizona, et al., (Case No. 92-16954) pending in the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit; and WHEREAS, the Governor of Arizona called a special session of the Arizona legislature to address the requirements set forth by the Nation and the other Tribes in Arizona for implementation of a Tribal-State Gaming Compact even though the Governor had not accepted the terms of the Nation's proposed agreement in principle due to a continuing dispute over the number of gaming devices permitted under the proposed compact and the extent and process by which the scope of permissible gaming would be reopened should the State authorize additional off-reservation gaming; and

WHEREAS, during the course of the special legislative session Tribal leaders of the Arizona Tribes united in agreement on the terms of the proposed Tribal-State Gaming Compact including the number of gaming devices permissible under the proposed Compact; and

16		the Council the Committee's best recommendation for a Tribal-

18 19	NOW, THER	EFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislative Council accepts
20		the recommendation of the Nation's Gaming Negotiating
21		Committee and approves the proposed Tribal-State Gaming

25	BE IT FURT	THER RESOLVED that the Legislative Council authorizes the
26		Nation's Chairman to execute on behalf of the Tohono
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28		O'Odham Nation the attached Tribal-State Gaming Compact,

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subject to technical changes to form, and provided that an additional provision shall be added to the Compact that provides that should any other Tribe in Arizona obtain a compact or procedures which authorize more gaming devices or types of gaming than are included in this Compact, then the Tohono O'Odham Nation - State of Arizona Compact will be amended to include such gaming, so long as such provisions are approved by the Gaming Negotiating Committee.

The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council on the 15TH. day of JUNE, 1993 at a meeting at which a quorum 16 was present with a vote of 1.695.5 FOR; 67.5 AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and 03 ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section 1 (b) & (f) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
