**WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation is committed to insuring that
human remains and associated materials encountered during
construction projects are treated with respect and appropriately
dealt with based on O'odham custom, tradition and Federal
protection statutes; and**

**WHEREAS, members of the Cultural Preservation Committee have been
involved in the development of the specific project noted in the
caption of this Resolution; and**

**WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the Tohono O'odham Nation to enter
into the Memorandum of Understanding attached to this
Resolution.**

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative
Council that the Chairman of the Tohono O'odham Nation is
hereby authorized to execute the attached Memorandum of
Understanding regarding Native American Human Remains and
Associated Material encountered as a result of Subsurface
Archaeological Testing of Sites AZ U:10:20 and AZ U:10:25
(ASU), and AZ U:10:60 through AZ U:10:68 (ASM) at Williams**
