WHEREAS,	the Arizona State Legislature passed Senate Bill 1001 as an					
	attempt to prohibit casino-type gaming from being conducted					
	within the State and in response to the court-appointed					
	mediator's selection of the Nation's last best offer for a tribal-					
	state gaming compact as the proposal which best comports with					
	the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act; and					

WHEREAS, although, the Governor of Arizona approved S.B. 1001 on March 5, 1993, the bill did not become law because of a referendum filed with the Arizona Secretary of State by the Committee for Fairness in Economic Development, which was organized by Arizona Tribes to keep S.B. 1001 from taking effect until voted on by the citizens of Arizona in the November 1994 general election; and

WHEREAS, subsequent to the filing of the referendum, the Governor of
Arizona continued to negotiate with Arizona tribes in an effort
to reach agreement for tribal-state gaming compacts; and

WHEREAS, in those negotiations the Governor of Arizona agreed to seek the repeal of S.B. 1001; and

WHEREAS, on June 24, 1993 the Chairman of the Tohono O'odham Nation and the Governor of Arizona signed the Tohono O'odham Nation-State of Arizona Gaming Compact; and
